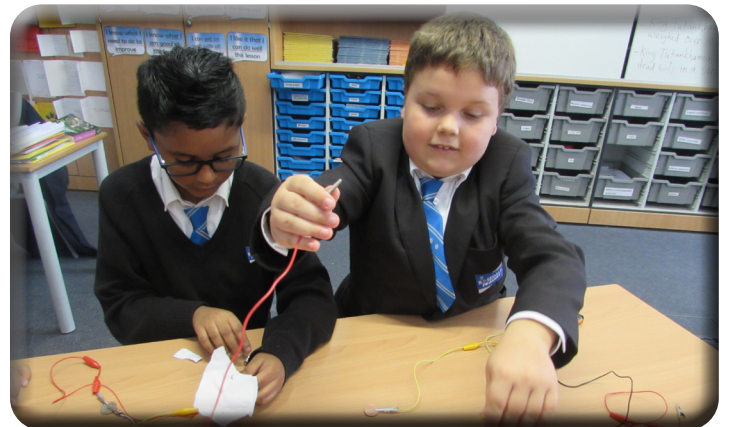
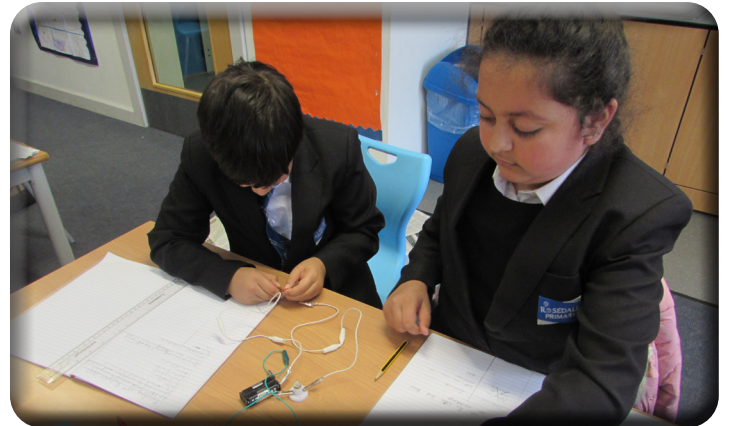
A is for Apple Pie!

The Nursery children have been working hard at learning the 'A' sound. To develop their understanding on the topic, they made their own 'Apple Pies', practising the 'A' sound whilst delighting in the preparation of their pies. They chopped up the apples, enhancing their fine motor skills in a fun and engaging way whilst simultaneously improving their phonics. Much to the children's delight, they capitalised on the opportunity to add some cream and chocolate to their pies before indulging in their sweet treat!



Electricity Experiment

Pupils had the opportunity to use a range of electrical components to build simple electric circuits. They used a battery, wire attached with crocodile clips, light bulb, buzzer, motor and switch. Accepting the challenge, they also built series circuits to demonstrate their deeper understanding of the topic. The children used different materials to test whether they are conductors or insulators of electricity before successfully building small fans using batteries, wires, motors and paper.

Little Amal is a 3.5 metre marionette representing a nine year old Syrian refugee girl who has fled her war-torn country, embarking on a remarkable journey in search of her mother. She has traversed Europe for over four months, voyaging from Turkey and has reached UK shores in the final leg of an 8,000 kilometre journey, with the hope that 'The Walk' will bring much-needed attention to all those who seek refuge and shine a light on the millions of displaced refugee children Amal represents.

Little Amal will arrive at London on **Saturday 23rd October** where she will visit some of London's iconic landmarks including St Paul's Cathedral and Shakespeare's Globe before celebrating her 10th birthday with us at Camden Town on Sunday 24th October where the Roundhouse have planned a birthday party and concert in her honour as she bids farewell to London.
