





ENGLISH

Poetry: Children will read and study haikus, tankas and cinquains, recognising the syllabic structure and use of powerful verbs and descriptive language. They will write using the traditional styles about seasons and nature. They will use their voice to add excitement to the poetry for their performance. Fables - Children will be learning about fables and their characteristics.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

MATHEMATICS

Arithmetic and reasoning problems are covered daily. Children will also learn about:

Data Handling, interpreting and presenting data using bar charts, pictograms and tables.

Measurements: Understand the use of units of measurement. Measure. compare add and subtract

Lengths (m/cm/mm). Mass/Volume and capacity.

SCIENCE

Magnetic Materials and Forces

Key Question: What is a fair test? Children will discuss how different things move, simple pushes and pulls, water, wind, clockwork, electricity and radio controls. They will learn how to enquire, do fair tests and draw conclusions. Children will look at naturally occurring magnetic rock called lodestone. learn about the origins of myths about how magnets work.

GEOGRAPHY: HISTORY

Geography Key Question: Where is Hayes? How are we connected to the world? Children will explore the United Kingdom and learn about the 4 countries that make up the UK. They will use compasses to understand directions.

History Key Question: Neolithic

Stone Age - What has changed, what have we invented and discovered? Skara Brae: How does this differ from the Stone Age?

Key Question: What do different people believe about God?

They will suggest the meanings of stories from sacred texts. Explore how ideas about God are shown in stories/narratives: Encounters which help believers to understand God's relationship with people, for example, Moses and the Burning Bush, Book of Jonah in the Old Testament. Baptism of Jesus. The Night of Power from the Qur'an. The Hindu texts and metaphors.

Safeguarding and being safe. Children will learn about antibullying and how we can promote kindness and respect.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Key Question: What skills and techniques can I use to create/choreograph a dance performance? Recognise and describe the effects of exercise on the body. Know the importance of flexibility. Explain why it is important to warm up and cool down.

MUSIC – This half term, children will learn to sing songs for their Christmas performance, rehearse in time to the music and perform. French, children will learn nouns and answer questions. ICT - children will use Purple Mash to create graphics as well as newspaper reports.
