



YEAR TWO (2) SPRING 1- WHAT WILL YOUR CHILD LEARN THIS HALF TERM?



ENGLISH

Key Question: What are traditional tales? How do they unite communities?

Core Texts: CHARLIE AND THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY. Children will also experience traditional tales from a variety of cultures.

Children will also learn about nonfiction texts, information texts. They will focus on grammatical features, spelling and handwriting.

MATHEMATICS

Key Areas:

Children will continue with learning place value using the correct vocabulary, describing position.

They will use number lines for addition and subtraction as well as grids.

Children will learn mental addition and subtraction for problem solving.

SCIENCE

Key Question: How do living plants depend on each other, what is necessary for plants to grow?

Children develop and understand how animals and plants are able to adapt to different habitats for their survival.

Children will learn about how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals using food chains.

GEOGRAPHY:HISTORY

Key Question: Geography
Where on earth did chocolate come
from? Did it grow somewhere?

Children will learn about the origins of chocolate.

Key Question: History
Who brought chocolate to Europe
and why is it so popular with most
people?

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Key Question: What can we learn from Sacred Texts?

Explore what a story is and why we like them. Exploring what a parable is and recognise some ways in which Christians, Muslims and Jewish people treat their sacred books.

Children will be able to share their own experiences.
