

ENGLISH

Key Question: What made Matilda unique?

Fiction: Matilda by Roald Dahl

Children will make predictions around the front cover, writing character and setting descriptions using descriptive language, writing a different story using the main characters with different characteristics and a different plot.

MATHEMATICS

Pupils will further understand:

Fractions: Add and subtract fractions with same and different denominators, and simplifying fractions to their simplest forms.

Multiplication: 3 digit numbers using partitioning, grid method, expanded written method and chunking method for division.

Measurements: Perimeter and area by counting scaled boxes and calculation.

Statistics: Reading bus and train timetables to find information to answer

SCIENCE

Key Question: What are habitats? Why are habitats necessary?

Living Things and their habitats.

Habitats: Classification of living things in a various way using biological vocabulary.
