



YEAR ONE (1) SUMMER ONE - WHAT WILL YOUR CHILD LEARN THIS HALF TERM?



ENGLISH

Main Texts: Peter Pan, Pinocchio. What are the main components of fantasy stories?

Writing: children will use their phonics knowledge, grammar, punctuation and spelling to write to entertain the reader, they will explore fiction books and develop their writing further.
Children will also study poetry.

MATHEMATICS

Some of the areas covered:

Addition and subtraction:

Using number bonds to solve word problems.
Fractions: concepts of halves and wholes will be revisited.
Quarters of shapes and misconceptions will be addressed, Children will also use multiplication

SCIENCE

Key Questions: How do we experiment? What is a prediction?

Children will learn about every day materials and their uses.

GEOGRAPHY and History

Key Question: History. What toys do children have around the world?

Key Question: Geography, Why are maps necessary?

Around the world using maps and globes.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Key Question: What does it mean to belong to a faith community?

Year 1 will be building on their learning about Christian and Islamic beliefs and will be enquiring into the different welcoming ceremonies which take place in each faith.

Children will build their knowledge about the communities they belong to and how they affect their lives. They will also think about what belonging to a community means to different people.

PSHE

Key Themes: Relationships Mutual Respect

and division.

Children will continue to learn about British Values in particular understanding others who may be different in culture, language and background and what we have in common as people indigenous and otherwise. They will continue to appreciate their peers and know how the 6rs are a building block and foundation in getting to the next steps of our journey in school and wider community. They will realise the differences and commonalities of their faiths and beliefs with others.



Key Question: What is a sculpture?

Children will create sculptures learn about the work of famous artists. Children will develop a range of art and design techniques using colour, pattern, texture, form and shape as well as line and shape.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Key Question: What are my strengths and weaknesses in athletics?

Children will develop their athletic skills through activities such as sprinting and relay. They will be able to identify the changes that happen to their bodies though exercise and how they can improve their techniques through regular practice.

They will continue to build on their catching and throwing skills, thinking carefully about how their stance can change the effectiveness of their throwing.

MUSIC – Children will explore sounds use the word pitch. They will realise how pitch and mood can be changed. They will understand how music can be used to tell stories and how characters are represented through the different pitches.
