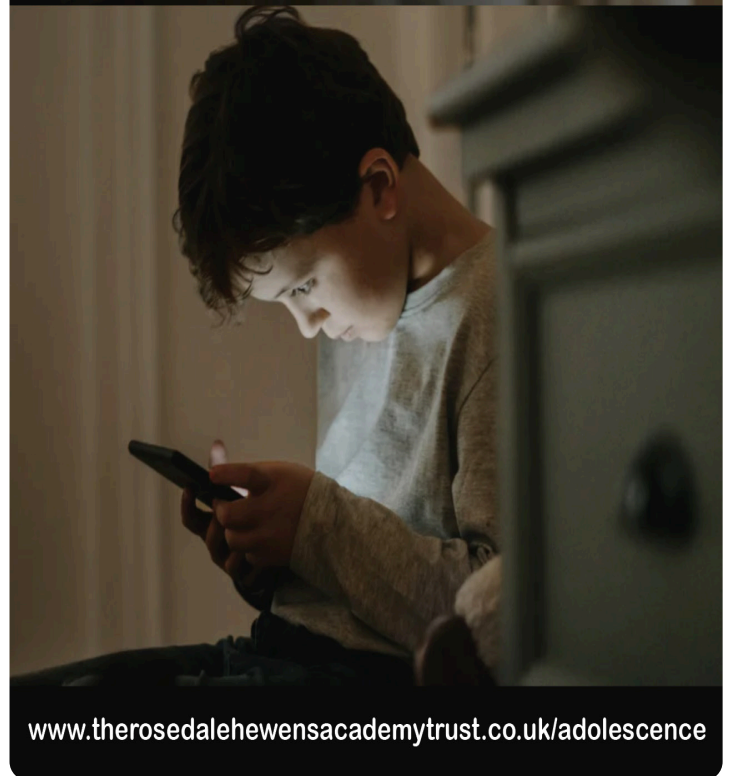


What Can We Learn From Netflix's Adolescence - Resources For Parents, Guardians and Carers
