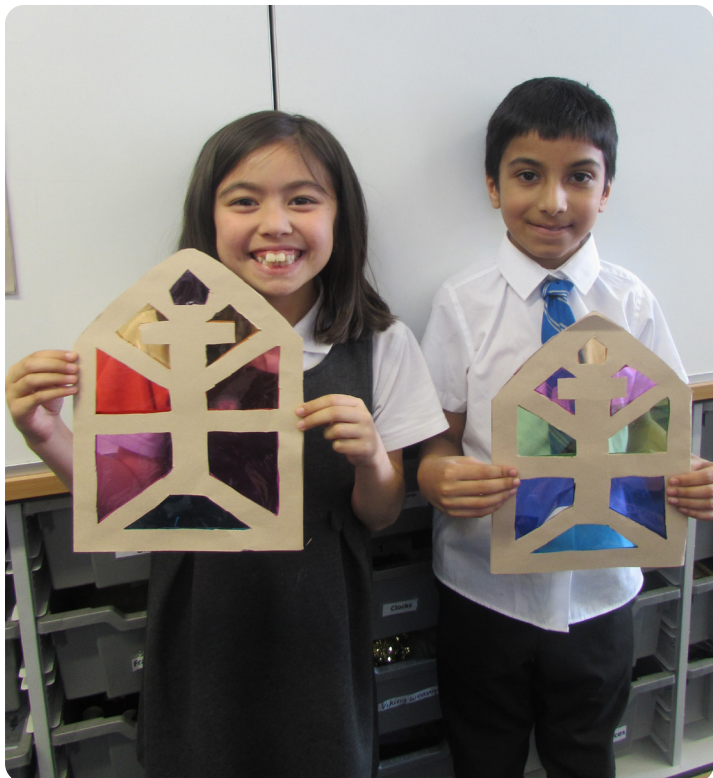




Stained Glass Project – Year 4
